## **Madison man claims \$63,000 Badger 5 prize Stoughton \$40.7 million Powerball ticket and Middleton \$200,000 Powerball ticket still out there**

(Madison)—Timothy Neal of Madison is definitely bucking a trend. Neal went to the Wisconsin Lottery's Madison office and claimed a \$63,000 prize from the Lottery's Badger 5 drawing held May 4<sup>th</sup>.

He did NOT follow in the more tentative footsteps of two other recent Dane County winners: the holder of a \$40.7 million Powerball ticket sold in Stoughton back on March 31<sup>st</sup>, and the holder of a \$200,000 Powerball ticket sold at a Middleton PDQ on April 14th.

Those tickets remain unclaimed.

Neal bought a \$3 quick-pick ticket and matched all five winning numbers in the May 4<sup>th</sup> Badger 5 drawing (02, 14, 18, 27, 31) to claim his prize. He receives \$43,000 after taxes.

The Sherman Ave. Quik Mart, which sold Neal's winning ticket, receives \$1,260. Wisconsin Lottery retailers who sell winning tickets with prizes of \$600 or more earn a commission equivalent to 2% of the ticket's prize value, up to a maximum commission of \$100,000.

Badger 5 is a \$1 daily terminal-generated game with jackpots that start at \$10,000 and grow a minimum of \$1,000 a day until they are won. Players win the rolling jackpot by matching their five numbers to the five winning numbers drawn each night.
