## **Appleton man claims share of \$197,000 jackpot split three ways**

(Madison)—Three people won an equal share of the Wisconsin Lottery's \$197,000 Badger 5 jackpot on Friday, November 16. Now an Appleton man has stepped forward to claim his cut.

Carey Lappen of Appleton validated one of three winning tickets in that November 16 drawing, winning a prize of \$65,666: one third of the drawing's \$197,000 jackpot.

Lappen bought his winning ticket at Greenville Amoco, W6308 Levi Dr., Greenville. The other two jackpot tickets were sold in Green Bay and Whitewater. Those winners have yet to come forward.

Last Friday night's winning Badger 5 numbers were 12, 14, 17, 27 and 30.

For selling Lappen's winning ticket, Greenville Amoco earns a \$3,940 commission from the Wisconsin Lottery. Lottery retailers who sell winning tickets with prizes of \$600 or more earn the equivalent of 2% of the prize value, up to a maximum of \$100,000. The winning ticket commission is based on the original value of the prize, regardless of the number of tickets that may claim a share of it. In this instance the original prize was \$197,000. All three selling retailers earn a commission based on that figure: \$3,940.

Badger 5 is a \$1 daily terminal-generated game with jackpots that start at \$10,000 and grow a minimum of \$1,000 a day until they are won. Players win the rolling jackpot by matching their five numbers to the five winning numbers drawn each night.
