Whitewater woman claims second share of \$197,000 jackpot

(Madison)—And then there were two.

Last week, Carey Lappen of Appleton claimed his share of a \$197,000 Badger 5 jackpot from November 16th that was split among three winning tickets.

Now, a Whitewater woman has emerged as the owner of the second winning ticket.

Susan Johnson validated her Badger 5 ticket for the November 16th drawing and claimed a prize of \$65,666: her share of the \$197,000 jackpot.

Johnson, Lappen and a third ticket holder who purchased a winning ticket in Green Bay matched all five winning numbers in the November 16th Badger 5 drawing. Those winning numbers were 12, 14, 17, 27, and 30.

Johnson bought her ticket at Westsider Citgo, 1353 W. Main St., Whitewater.

For selling Johnson's winning ticket, Westsider Citgo earns a \$3,940 commission from the Wisconsin Lottery. Lottery retailers who sell winning tickets with prizes of \$600 or more earn the equivalent of 2% of the prize value, up to a maximum of \$100,000. The winning ticket commission is based on the original value of the prize, regardless of the number of tickets that may claim a share of it. In this instance the original prize was \$197,000. All three selling retailers earn a commission based on that figure: \$3,940.

Badger 5 is a \$1 daily terminal-generated game with jackpots that start at \$10,000 and grow a minimum of \$1,000 a day until they are won. Players win the rolling jackpot by matching their five numbers to the five winning numbers drawn each night.
