No word yet on Caledonia \$1 million Powerball ticket



(Madison) —It's been more than a week since a \$1 million Wisconsin Lottery Powerball ticket was sold in Caledonia in Racine County, and so far not a word from the winner.

"We hope whoever has this \$1 million ticket realizes it and is just getting some advice on how to manage the money once the prize is paid," said Lottery spokesperson Andrew Bohage.

The ticket was sold at Mobil on the Park, 911 S. 27th St. in Caledonia. It matched all five regular winning numbers in the August 26 Powerball drawing, making it a \$200,000 winning ticket. However, the ticket buyer also purchased Powerball's Power Play prize multiplier feature, which turned the \$200,000 prize into a \$1 million winner.

The ticket-holder has 180 days from the drawing to claim the prize. The \$1 million ticket must be validated at the Lottery's headquarters in Madison.

The August 26 winning numbers were 01, 21, 23, 30 and 43, with a Powerball of 11.

Power Play is a feature of Powerball that gives all non-jackpot winners a chance to multiply their prizes for an additional \$1 for each set of Powerball numbers they purchase. Before each Powerball drawing a Power Play number from 2-5 is drawn. Players who purchase Power Play and who then win prizes of \$3 to \$10,000 will have their prizes multiplied by the night's Power Play number. Players who purchase Power Play who win the \$200,000 prize will automatically have their prize multiplied by five regardless of the Power Play number drawn, turning their prizes into \$1 million prizes.
