Madison, Barron Powerball winners claim prizes



(Madison) —Two players have claimed the major prizes they won in two separate Wisconsin Lottery Powerball drawings.

Eleanor Rapacz of Madison won \$10,000 in the October 31 Powerball drawing. She matched four of the five regular winning numbers drawn that night PLUS the Powerball to win her \$10,000 prize. The Powerball winning numbers on October 31 were 02, 19, 26, 41 and 54, with a Powerball of 23.

Rapacz bought her winning ticket at Seversin's Service Center, 3401 Milwaukee St. in Madison. For selling that ticket, Seversin's earns \$200 from the Lottery. Lottery retailers who sell winning tickets with prizes of \$600 or more earn the equivalent of 2% of the prize, up to a maximum commission of \$100,000.

Chester Miller of Barron claimed his \$20,000 Powerball prize today from the October 24 drawing. Like Rapacz, Miller matched four of the five regular winning numbers plus the Powerball to win \$10,000. However, Miller also purchased the "Power Play" prize multiplier feature, which multiplied his \$10,000 prize by the night's multiplier number, which was two.

The winning Powerball numbers on the 24th were 14, 22, 38, 49 and 59, with a Powerball of 16.

Miller bought his winning ticket at the Korner Stop, 7 S. Mill St. in Barron. For selling that \$20,000 winning ticket, Korner Stop earns \$400 from the Lottery.
