Twin Lakes man claims \$1 million Powerball prize *Power Play turns \$200,000 prize into \$1 million*



(Madison) —For the third time this year a Wisconsin Lottery Powerball player has used the game's Power Play feature to become a millionaire.

Kenneth Grogan of Twin Lakes presented the Lottery today with a valid \$1 million winning ticket from Wednesday night's Powerball drawing. Grogan's ticket, which he purchased at Genoa Liquor, 413 Walworth St., Genoa City, matched all five regular winning numbers drawn Wednesday night and would have been worth \$200,000, had he not also purchased Powerball's Power Play prize multiplier feature. That automatically turned his prize into a \$1 million winner.

After taxes Grogan receives \$672,556. He has declined to take part in a news conference.

Wednesday's winning Powerball numbers were 01, 06, 10, 13 and 20. The Powerball was 32. The Power Play prize multiplier number was 04.

For an additional \$1 per set of Powerball numbers, players can multiply all of their non-jackpot prizes by purchasing Power Play. The Power Play number is chosen in a separate drawing along with the night's Powerball numbers, and will multiply non-jackpot prizes from two to five times. However, anyone who wins the \$200,000 Powerball prize and has also purchased Power Play has his prize *automatically* multiplied by five--regardless of the Power Play number drawn. A \$200,000 winner with Power Play becomes a \$1 million winner.

The last \$1 million Power Play winner in Wisconsin was Ron Horton of Fond du Lac. Horton won his \$1 million prize in March.
