Badger 5 \$248,000 Jackpot Split Seven Ways

Second time in Lottery history – jackpot divided among seven winning tickets

MADISON, Wis. - Friday, August 7's, Badger 5 jackpot of \$248,000 was split among seven different winning tickets, tying a record set on February 5, 2016. The prize money allocated to the Badger 5 jackpot is equally divided by the number of players correctly matching all five numbers, each winner takes home \$35,428.

On April 30, 2020 the largest Badger 5 jackpot ever—\$411,000—was won with a ticket purchased at Coopers 10-39 BP in Stevens Point.

Retailers who sell winning tickets over \$599 receive an incentive of 2 percent of the winning ticket amount up to \$100,000. Each of the retailers will receive 2 percent of the overall jackpot amount.

The odds of winning the Badger 5 jackpot is 1 in 169,911. Badger 5 is drawn daily after 9 p.m. Tickets must be purchased before 9 p.m. to be included in that day's drawing.

ABOUT THE WISCONSIN LOTTERY

The Wisconsin Lottery enriches communities statewide by giving back 93 percent of its revenue to winners, retailers, and Wisconsin homeowners.
