## All or Nothing Lotto Game Celebrates Two Years

Over \$18 Million in total prizes won

MADISON, Wis. - The Wisconsin Lottery is celebrating two years since the launch of the All or Nothing Lotto game. The \$2 game debuted on April 7, 2019. In two years, over \$18 Million in total prizes have been won—including 53 \$100,000 top prize wins. To win the top prize, players can match all 11 numbers or none of the 11 numbers. Thirty-five top prize winners won by matching none of the numbers and 18 top prize winners won by matching all 11 numbers.

All or Nothing was the state's first new Lotto game since 2014 and has proven to be popular among Lottery players who enjoy the unique ways to win. On June 14. 2020, All or Nothing added a Midday draw and is now drawn twice daily.

All or Nothing's \$500 second prize has had 5,152 winners. Of the 5,152 \$500 winners, 49% of those winners matched 1 of the 11 numbers and 51% of the winners matched 10 of the 11 numbers.

The odds of winning All or Nothing's \$100,000 top prize are 1 in 352,716. The odds of winning All or Nothing's \$500 prize are 1 in 2,916. Drawings are held every day after 1:30 p.m. for Midday draws and after 9:00 p.m. for Evening draws. Tickets must be purchased before 1:30 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. to be included in that day's Midday or Evening drawing.
